
To commemorate the efforts that Indigenous veterans and soldiers have given to Canada, Gleneagle Secondary students created an exhibit where students and teachers could learn more about these veterans' sacrifices. Along with panels in the centre of the exhibit providing information, grade 12 student Deon Feng also created two sets of sketches about the unfair and racist treatment the veterans received after they returned from war. Soldiers of Indigenous heritage took part in every major battle and campaign, including the Normandy Invasion and the Battle of Hong Kong. Over 200 soldiers lost their lives in WWII.


Indigenous communities raised and donated \$44,000 by the end of WWI and \$23,000 in WWII
